

Appropriate Assessment Screening Determination

CP1225 Finglas-Corduff 220 kV Protection Upgrade [Exempted Development] (County Dublin)

In accordance with Article 6(3) of the EU Habitats Directive (Directive 92/43/EEC) and Regulation 42(1) of the European Communities (Birds and Natural Habitats) Regulations 2011 as amended ('The Regulations'), EirGrid has undertaken Appropriate Assessment (AA) screening to assess, in view of best scientific knowledge and the conservation objectives of relevant European sites, if the Cashla and Connected Stations Protection Upgrade [Exempted Development] ('the development') individually or in combination with other plans or projects would be likely to have a significant effect (s) on a European site(s).

The scope of the works shall occur wholly within the compounds of the Corduff and Finglas substations. The development will consist of works for the purpose of renewing and altering protection equipment on the Corduff - Finglas 220 kV Circuit No. 1 and Corduff - Finglas 220 kV Circuit No. 2.

The development is not located within or adjacent any European sites. The nearest European site to the development is the South Dublin Bay and River Tolka Estuary Special Protection Area (SPA) (site code 4024)¹, located c. 8 km from the development. This determination has had regard for the conservation objectives of these and any other relevant European sites.

In accordance with Regulation 42(7) of the European Communities (Birds and Natural Habitats) Regulations 2011 SI 477 as amended, EirGrid has made a determination following screening that an Appropriate Assessment is not required as the project individually or in combination with other plans or projects is not likely to have a significant effect on any European sites. The risk of likely significant effects on European sites can be excluded on the basis of objective evidence.

This determination is based on the location, scale, extent and duration of the development, including temporary works, and has not taken account of measures intended to avoid or reduce significant effects on European sites.
