2. Minutes of last Forum Meeting - March 5 th 2024		
	The Minutes of the last forum meeting were agreed. Proposed by Cllr. Anne Marie Aherne and seconded by Cllr.Sheila O'Callaghan.	

3. Update on Celtic Interconnector Project Progress - (Presentation Attached)

Michelle Walsh (EirGrid) provided an update on the Celtic Interconnector Project. Key messages included:

12 Months of Construction celebrated in October. A number of Keys milestones have been met with more to come.

Cable Works Trenching and Ducting

- Trenching and ducting of HVAC cable route Knockraha to Ballyadam: Completed.
- Trenching and ducting of HVDC cable route Ballyadam to Youghal Completed Sections: Ballyadam to N25, N25 Phase 1 & off-road sections.
- Trenching and ducting of HVDC cable route Currently working on Ballyadam to Youghal Active Sections: N25 Phase 2 (Castlemartyr to Killeagh), Front Strand Road, Youghal.

Currently works underway on the approach road to Claycastle Beach from Summerfield Cross. Managed in two phases using a Stop/Go System and working at night for a short period of time next week to ensure road remains open and accessible to traffic for the majority of time works are underway.

• Reinstatement works continuing on all roads that have been impacted – particularly local roads.

Cable Works – Cable Pulling

- Cable pulling HVAC completed. (Ballyadam to Knockraha)
- Cable pulling HVDC (Ballyadam to Youghal) commencing early Q2 2025 generally working eastwards from Youghal to Ballyadam
- Jointing of cables once pulled to continue in sequence in jointing bays located along the cable route

Gogganstown Substation

Civil works ongoing – completion in early Q2 2025.

Marine Surveys

• Completed for 2024

Ballyadam Converter Station

- Steelworks & Wall Cladding to Converter Building ongoing
- Roof & Wall Cladding to Control Building ongoing

• Foundations & plinths to Transformer / AC Yard / Cooler Area ongoing and nearing completion

Christmas Shutdown

20 December 2024 to 02 January 2025 to include Trafic Management on the current N25 Phase 2 from Castlemartry to Killeagh being removed for the Christmas Period. Details to be also posted online.

Claycastle Works

- EirGrid will be undertaking works on the Celtic Interconnector Landfall site at Claycastle beach in the Carparking area.
- Bulk of works programme is planned to be conducted over winter period to minimise impact on amenity.
- Access to beach, Boardwalk and carpark will be maintained throughout the works Work to be carried out within clearly defined compounds.
- Works planned to be conducted in 5 distinct phases starting in December 2024 and completing in June 2025 (weather dependent).

Phase 1: Support Area December 2024 - April 2025 – Site Compound established within the Carparking area.

Phase 2: Storage Area January 2025 – December 2026 – Also set out and boarded in the Carparking area.

Phase 3: Beach works December 2024 - April 2025 — Once the Compounds and Site Work areas are established and the project is ready, the beach works will commence ideally in December. This involves the establishment of a works corridor area (Cofferdam) leading from the carparking area down to the High Water Mark. This will allow for Trenching and ducting to be installed and cables pulled through in a manner similar to installation on the roads.

Phase 4: Offshore Works April 2025 – June 2025 (Weather Dependant)

Phase 5: Car Park Works April 2025

Establishment of Transition Joint Bay where Marine Cable is connected to Land Cable and the areas restored to its original status. Within a short period time it won't be obvious that any works have been carried out at the beach area.

Questions/Comments

In relation to Knockraha Roadworks, the local Community Association feedback is that the Mud verges are unsafe. Elsewhere on the route, Limestone Chippings have been placed in the verges to make them safe. This problem has been highlighted before and issues were to be addressed. The Road itself has a lot of potholes and is difficult to travel. The Road is not in a fit to travel on and cars can't pass.

In some cases, the subcontractors are not adhering to traffic regulations in place in relation to approaching the substation.

Acknowledgement of good communication and engagement work done by EirGrid.

Acknowledgement of difficulties faced with addressing the type of ongoing issues raised resulting from the necessary work.

Unfortunately there have been huge difficulties along the substation road, unfortunately because it is being trafficked.d still the issues rose early as the project started in that area. When large machinery has to pull in, the soil verges are being damaged. It was requested at accouncil meeting that 804

Answers/Response

Queries and concerns raised will be brought back to the team for further consideration. EirGrid are already aware of some of them. Answers already provided may need to be revisited. The process of temporary reinstatement (road covering to be able to withstand six months of use) is an established procedure for roads. However, within that sixmonth period the complete and Following the period of temporary reinstatement full reinstatement does have to be reinstated completed.

stone be used to backfill the verges to create a passing bay for traffic. The substation road is surrounded by a lot of residences and utilised a lot. Concerns that subcontractors are not adhering to traffic regulations in place raised above were reiterated.

Again, acknowledgement of good communication and engagement work done. Acknowledgement of difficulties faced with addressing the type of ongoing issues raised resulting from the necessary work.

The Road surface in the estat Cork area is also an issue. Not only the road surface that has been refilled by EirGrid, but when roads have been closed somewhere the machinery is on the other side of the road and parts of the road have been damaged by machinery along with large potholes. In current weather conditions with iclee and rain potholes cannot be seen. Claims are going in to Cork Co. Council which has an exceptionally low road budget. It is unfair that this is impacting on Cork Co. Council when the issue is not being caused by Cork Co. Council.

Loose Chippings are used on the resurfacing of the road but no sweeper is used. A nNon-sSlip tTarring is being used and there appears to be a lot of skids on the road given the surface that is currently there.

Loose <u>c</u>Chippings by Bends facing into the sun (near Carrigogna Bridge) is causing cars to skid.

6. Update on Community Benefit Fund

Elaine Barrett (SECAD) provided an update on the Celtic Interconnector Community Benefit Fund. Key messages included:

Phase 1 Update

29 Successful applicants. Some projects have been completed, fully claimed and paid out. Some projects are still due to come into claim. Reminders regarding the expiring date have been issued and. SECAD are there to help and support any groups where needs. Forum members are requested to pass this message along.

Contract expiry dates

For groups to be eligible to apply to Phase 2, Phase 1 projects will need to have been fully completed and claimed for.

Phase 2

Phase 2 is expected to be opened by the end of January. The application process will remain open for approximately eight weeks. Phase 2 has a value of €720,000 to be divided between the three streams of the Fund, The Community Stream, The Sustainability Stream and the Biodiversity Stream. There has been an underspend for the Biodiversity Stream which will be noted in the Guidelines for Phase 2.

Notification to the Forum Members

Forum members will be notified by email before 1pm the day the fund opens and are requested to forward on the email notification to community groups in their area. Groups on the SECAD database will be notified in the afternoon. There may however be new or emerging groups or groups who did not apply for phase 1 funding and widespread dissemination of the notification is requested.

Preparation for applicants

It is never too early to begin preparations. This is particularly recommended for groups expecting to require three quotations or anticipating having to engage in the planning process or clarify exemptions. Ensuring the groups constitution is available or where applicable, Owner Permissions or Letters of Support, copy of Leases are gathered in good time is strongly recommended.

SECAD support and assistance

Six One to One clinic supports will be arranged for the application period. Dates will be published in the notification email. Six days are also set aside for specific Biodiversity one to one clinics. Applicants that have a project in mind are encouraged to Contact SECAD for help and support.
